

Panshanger Primary School
Sports Premium funding 2017 / 18

In 2014 approx. £40 million was dedicated to aid provision for primary school PE and school sport.

The introduction of this Sport Premium money has given our school the opportunity to further our development in terms of PE and Sport.

Review of 2016 - 17

- ✓ A very successful competition year (2016 - 17) e.g. winners of the local dance competition, winning local football and netball matches, entry to second round events for athletics / basketball / hockey etc. This was a direct result of the opportunities offered and coaching sessions through involvement with the Schools Sports Partnership and the wide range of after school clubs run by school staff.
- ✓ Staff confidence and expertise has increased - result of the involvement of Michelle Salter (Schools Sports Coordinator) who has worked directly with Panshanger teachers.
- ✓ The children enjoyed the introduction of the new club 'dance' - this was aimed at KS2 children and the first sessions were well attended (mainly girls).
- ✓ The use of a specialist sports coach for one lunchtime a week has been influential in the children being more active. Additional equipment has been purchased to support this. One class a week has been working with the coach and the older children have particularly benefitted - having time by themselves to take part in a structured sporting activity.
- ✓ The introduction of trampolining during curriculum time for the Upper junior children has been both beneficial for the childrens' self-confidence and their coordination skills. Their skills by the end of the term were impressive with many of the children moving rapidly through an award scheme offered by the coaches.
- ✓ Lacrosse sessions popular with upper KS2 - pupil voice highlights that the children enjoy the sessions - they feel it is a 'different' sport and can see the transferable skills e.g. eye hand co-ordination / attacking and defending etc.

The action plan for the year has been monitored by the PE subject leader and the govs. through regular updates and reports. The monitoring takes the form of: lesson observations / pupil voice / monitoring of planning / pupil and staff audits and questionnaires.

For 2017 - 18 Panshanger will receive funding in the region of £16,250
