Science

• Continuing our topic on Reproduction the children will investigate similarities and differences in the life cycles of animals including mammals, insects, birds, amphibians and fish.

A second unit, *Growth & Development* asks the question 'Why and how does the human body change over time? 'The children will be required to

- identify ways in which the appearance of humans changes as they get older
- describe these changes
- identify some characteristics that will not change with age

English

- Writing opportunities with an initial focus on:
- -Persuasive writing techniques linked to the book 'The Misadventures of Fredrick by Ben Manley'. The children will write persuasive letters.
- -Non-Chronology report unit looking at the a range of information texts. This unit will give the children lots of opportunities to explore parenthesis, past tense, paragraphs, and colons.
- Reading individually, as a class and in small groups
- Spelling work including words to go home to be tested the week after.
- Handwriting reminder of basic letter formation and joins
- Grammar work e.g. subordinate clauses, tenses, adverbials, and parenthesis.

Maths

The range of units covered this half term comprises:

- Multiplication and division multiplying up to 4 digits by 2 digits using formal and informal methods. Short division, division with remainders and 'efficient methods' for division.
- MORE fractions! Multiplying fractions and finding fractions of an amount
- Decimals and % this will be introduced then continued in the next half term.

Music

A weekly music lesson will be taught by Mr Mitchell.



<u>Art</u>

We will use the theme of 'Cats' to explore different artists such as Paul Klee and Picasso. The children will try out techniques including continuous line drawing, creating rubbings and press printing and compare and contrast art works on the theme of cats.

DT

The children will be making moving toys with a cam mechcanisism.

Humanities (Geography, History & RE)

• History – Crime and punishment through the ages, from in the medieval times to modern day justice.



In RE the theme is 'Key figures in the Jewish Religion'.



PE

- We will have PE at least twice a week concentrating on
