## **English**

We will be completing the usual mixture of spellings, SPaG activities, reading and creative writing. We will finish out work on biographies in the first week, then we will look at persuasive writing – using the theme of children's rights.

ALL work will include grammar, spelling, reading, speaking and listening and handwriting skills.

### Maths

Maths will continue to be taught on a daily basis with regular fluency sessions. The children will continue to practise their multiplication and division facts regularly at home, quick recall is needed across the entire maths curriculum. TTrockstars will help with this. The main focus areas in this first half term are statistics, shape and geometry, as well as arithmetic and SATs revision

### RE & PHSE

In PSHE, we will explore mental health and discussing what we know about it and how we can support positive mental health in ourselves and others. RE, we will be looking at ideas about God in Christianity, as well as the children's own beliefs. We will be considering human responsibility to the environment and how this relates to the Christian creation story.



### Summer 1

Soon the SATs will be done learning will carry on but we will also be savouring our time at Panshanger - especially through fun activities.

Here's a great summer term!

### Science

We will be returning to living things - looking how animals change through time but also we can find clues or obvious signs of relations and ancestors.

### PE

<u>Mondays</u> - we will have cricket.

<u>Fridays</u> - Mrs Quinn will be helping us to improve our athletics skills.

We may have sessions on other days.

#### <u>Art</u>

In Art we will be using clay to help us explore architecture. We will look at famous pieces of architecture including Gaudi and Klimt. We will be planning and making our own clay houses.

## <u>Music</u>

We will be continuing to explore playing and improvising through the guidance of Mr Mitchell. <u>Geography:</u> What is climate change? What are the causes and how can we prevent it?

<u>History:</u> This unit uses three visual themes from history - Henry VIII, Elizabeth I and the Home Front (WWII). We will be looking "deeper" into the images to see beyond the obvious or the intended i.e. why does Henry VIII look so different in several paintings? Why does Elizabeth I look younger as she gets older?!

The children are expected to read regularly at home (at least 3 times a week). PLEASE continue with the reading practise at home as it is so important in all apsects of the curriculum.


